Job Board

Do you have a job to post or want to post your interest in gaining a position? Then go to

<http://wineserver.ucdavis.edu/fstjobs/>

If you are a first time user you must create an account by hitting the "Additional information for Job Posters" and then in the first sentence hit: *create a valid user account*. Once you have read the policy and created your account you then can immediately log-in and start entering your position. Your position is usually displayed within the hour or sooner, but could take up 24 hours since each position request is reviewed for authenticity to ensure it is NOT

posting or transmitting any unsolicited advertising, promotional materials, junk mail, "spam," chain letters, telephone calls or any other form of solicitation or any non-job related information such as opinions or notices.

Michael J Lewis Endowment



This fall, food science alumnus Doug Muhleman and his wife Juli Muhleman doubled the size of the Michael J. Lewis Endowment for Brewing Science with their \$100,000 gift to the fund. Doug and Juli are longtime supporters of UC Davis and brewing and food science in particular.

Established in 2008 with an initial gift from Anheuser-Busch Inc, the Fund

has grown over the years thanks to generous gifts from many friends and alumni of the brewing science program. Proceeds from the Lewis Endowment are designated to support the brewing science program in general but especially brewing science students. This year, the first endowment payout is being used to allow Masters student Nick Bokulich to study the microbiology of Lambic beers at the brewing school in Leuven, Belgium. This important opportunity would have been out of reach for Nick without Lewis Endowment funds to cover travel.

"This endowment is important to brewing and brewing science because it greatly increases our capability to attract the best and brightest students who will go on to become the brewers of tomorrow" said Charlie Bamforth, Anheuser-Busch Endowed Professor of Malting and Brewing Science. "I am grateful to all the alumni and friends who have given to the endowment and particularly the Muhlemans who have championed this effort from the beginning."

After years of service on the Food Science Leadership Board, Doug has gone on to volunteer leadership roles on the UC Davis Foundation Board of Trustees and the College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences Dean's Advisory Council. The Muhlemans' most recent gift to the Lewis Endowment was timed to coincide with the public launch of the Campaign for UC Davis.


